The Last Days of Pompeii and Herculaneum

Plaster Models





The plaster models in the ruins of Pompeii allow us to visualise the last moments of the people and the animals. There are pictures of a slave trying vainly to escape from his leg irons, of a dog writhing in pain and of people embracing each other in despair.

Graffiti

The graffiti messages of the people in Pompeii also tell us something about their lives before they suffered from the effects of the Mount Vesuvius eruption:


Atimetus has got me pregnant. Nobody is heroic unless he has loved.




I hope your piles irritate

More Details about Life and Death in Pompeii



The bread of the rich contained yeast and therefore was soft and fluffy. The bread of the poor was unleavened (containing no yeast) and was therefore flat and hard, a little like pita bread. People's inequality was even shown by the kind of bread they ate.



People used dice in Pompeii and they were not above cheating. Loaded dice have been found in the city; they had been weighted to fall on some numbers more often.

Most of the people who died in Pompeii survived for the first 22 hours or so. They ultimately died because of the intense heat, then were buried by the series of pyroclastic surges between 6.30 and 7.30am on August 25th, 79AD. This occurred almost 24 hours after the first explosion from Mount Vesuvius. A pyroclastic surge is a fluid mass of gas and rock that is both extremely hot and fast-flowing.



The ash, pumice and sand reached a height of 4 metres, burying the buildings so effectively that after several years had passed, people began to forget where the city had once stood.

It was only in 1744 that a farmer who was digging his land touched a statue with his shovel, accidentally discovering the most important archaeological site ever found.



Even though 2,000 people died, it is estimated that 10,000 people survived. They were the ones who fled from the city well before the pyroclastic surges began in the early hours of 25th August.
